

# **Safety Corner**

Great trips to Curacao and Indonesia, smaller trips to BVI, Lake Cumberland, and Dale Hollow - and the ol' reliable parties - Derby, Pig Roast, and the Christmas Party - made this year one to remember. The good news is, no serious accidents happened, at least non scuba-related. (Note to self: stay off 4-wheelers).

With the giving season coming up, why not think about what items you need to make your next dive season a safe and fun one? I'm not recommending any particular product - you all know your own likes and dislikes, but I wanted to point out that keeping your gear up to date is a very important part of safety. Keeping your skills up to date is as well.

Make this a very Merry Christmas for yourself or your best dive buddy by giving the gift that keeps on giving scuba presents! Best wishes for a very happy, safe, and blessed holiday season!



## **Christmas Ideas for BGDC**

# STOCKING STUFFERS

There are lots of smaller items that will make your dive buddy's stocking a true treasure chest this year. What about that old safety whistle that has lost its loudness? A save-a-dive kit would be a wonderful and easy thing to put together - some replacement o-rings, a replacement mask and fin strap, all in a small bag - inexpensive and really appreciated. How about a small dive slate/pencil combination, or a tank-banger - both are good communications tools. Tubes of silicone gel or mask defog are always welcome, or perhaps a package of "Sink the Stink" will make your dive partner a little more 'user friendly'.

What about those items you never 'need', but your friendly neighborhood SID is always reminding you about? A snorkel – maybe a collapsible one for your BC pocket – is an important piece of safety gear. Also, everyone should have something with which to cut lines or straps that need it – even a small knife or dive shears can save your life or your buddy's.



Sun protection is always good – a unique cap or a scuba-themed do-rag would be nice. You could even buy some sunscreen and aloe lotion, to prepare those winter-white bodies for some tropical trip.

For something a little more pricey, but very useful, how about a new pair of sunglasses? Make sure you get UV blockers – I like polarization too. Team that with a set of Croakies or other flotation device and a crush-proof case, and you've got a great gift.



#### UNDER THE TREE

Check out your BC, regulator, and computer. Now would be a good time to remember the leaky hoses or worn out straps you noticed at the end of your last dive trip – look at the different models of gear at your local dive purveyor and drop some major

hints. (Giving exact part numbers and sizes are important ideas, if you want to make sure things fit.)



Christmas is a time of surprises – think about items your dive buddy wouldn't buy for themselves. Maybe an integrated system or a new model fin. What about that add-on: perhaps a cableless integrated computer system, or a low volume mask. Those may be a little more that you wanted to shell out for your buddy, but remember, you are your own best buddy, right?



Some things need to be bought by the individual. Environmental protection gear – wetsuits, drysuits, hoods, gloves, booties, all should be bought for the individual fit. If you've lost a few pounds over the holidays (okay, so we know that is impossible) or maybe gained a few ounces, your wetsuit may malfunction. How does it malfunction, you ask? If water leaks in and out freely, or it is too tight – binding or stretching out of shape – then it won't properly keep you warm. More importantly, if you have to struggle in our out of it on the surface, you could overheat – just as dangerous. Make sure all your gear is right-sized for your current body size and shape.

#### WON'T FIT UNDER A TREE

One of the nicest things you can give a diver is a gift of learning. Refresher courses or specialty courses can make your diving experience more fun and a lot safer. New directions give you a great way to get more water time, and perhaps figure out a new destination for your next trip. If you do select a new specialty, that opens up a whole new avenue for presents for next Christmas or even birthdays, Easter, Arbor Day, or even National Jelly Bean Day (April 22) or perhaps Be Bald and Be Free Day (October 14) – the options are limitless. Money isn't a bad idea, either, so your buddy can join you on the next BGDC expedition. Hope these thoughts give you some ideas... it would work for me... (hint, hint).

# The Webmaster's Tip

Have you ever heard of "Sticky Keys?" No, I don't mean the kind you get after dropping food on your keyboard!

**StickyKeys** is an accessibility feature in Microsoft Windows designed for people who have difficulty holding down two or more keys at a time. When a shortcut requires a key combination such as CTRL+P, StickyKeys will enable you to press one key at a time instead of pressing them simultaneously.

Press the SHIFT key five or more times in rapid succession and you will see the following alert pop up.



Clicking "OK" will turn on StickyKeys. Select the "Settings Tab" and you will see the following dialog with many more interesting options.



Check or uncheck the "Use StickyKeys" box to turn the feature on or off. For more info − CLICK HERE. ►
