Safety Corner

Note: This month's Safety Corner focuses on dive travel. Well, it could be extrapolated to work with almost any travel, but since the BGDC tends to visit some very interesting places – and many international destinations – it is very pertinent.

With this month's trip to Roatan coming up, we'll face some of the potential problems with traveling to an international destination, with limited communications to you, and a little planning will go a long way.

Most of this is just common sense, but it might prove helpful to you to have all the ideas in one place. You will have some peace of mind on your travels, which can result in a safe trip, and as always...



Remember, safe diving is fun!



Planning Tips for Safe Dive Travel

Destination Dependent - some preparations will vary based on where you're going.

- What will the weather be like during your stay? Check out <u>http://www.weather.com</u> to find out what the 10 day forecast might be for your location. Do you need rain gear? Do you need a jacket or sweater in the evening?
- What kind of exposure protection will you need for your diving? Check out the water temperature for US destinations by going to <u>http://www.nodc.noaa.gov/dsdt/cwtg/</u> and then selecting your destination area. Google for the same info for international trips.



- 3. Will you be somewhere that you can purchase any dive equipment or personal needs? Our own webmaster McCann does a great job in putting pertinent links on the BGDC site for each trip, including resort info. Chamber of Commerce or travel/tourism links, and so forth. Do a little Googling of your own to see what is nearby. Don't just assume you can buy anything you need until you get the details. Do they take credit cards? Do they accept US currency? All important info that you don't want to wait till you're there to find out. This also means you must make sure to bring any important things like medicines with you.
- 4. If the trip is international in nature, you might want to review the Safety Corner

about traveling abroad, saved in our website at <u>http://www.bluegrassdiveclub.com/bgdc10</u> 04.pdf. This should include the need for

any electrical adapters, etc.



 If you have any kind of allergies, is your destination aware of that – things like food allergies need to be addressed proactively. Find out if there are any reasons to get vaccinations before you travel.



Packing – make sure you have what you need on the trip, and information in the right places.

1. What documentation will you need? Ticket confirmations, a list of addresses and phone numbers for the resort or other destinations you want to find when you get to the area are important. If you need a

passport for your trip, make sure you have a copy of the first page somewhere separate from the passport itself. Make a copy and leave it with someone at home. Leave contact info and your itinerary with someone at home as well, in case something happens. Bring a copy of your prescriptions, just in case you need to get them refilled, or if there are questions by authorities whether you have a medical reason to bring the drugs into their jurisdiction. A copy of your prescription for glasses is a good idea also. Make a list of credit cards and the service phone numbers for them. If your card is stolen or lost, you want to alert the company as quickly as possible - and it also helps shorten the replacement cycle.



- As you pack, make sure everything is in working order – things like dive gear, watches, travel alarms, flashlights, etc. and that you have extra batteries. Test out your dive gear and service it before you travel. Use a check list to make sure you pack all you need, and edit your check list after each trip when you determine it needs it. (A previous Safety Corner provided a check list, but many are available on line.)
- Put your identification and contact info inside each bag, as well as a copy of your itinerary. If your external bag tags are torn off, make sure the airlines have a way to find out whose bag it is, and get it to you.

DIVE CLUB HISTORY

The Bluegrass Divers Club, as it was called when our club first started, was brought about when the local dive shop "Aqua Shop", owned by Billy Forbes and Dan Conway, decided they needed to start a club for divers to get together for social and diving experiences.



The first meetings back in 1970 took place at St. Paul Catholic "Ava Maria building". The club moved several times during the next 10 years and finally settled down and became associated with the downtown YMCA. The club changed its name to Bluegrass YMCA Dive Club. That association lasted about 10 years.

Things changed again when most of the club members decided they wanted the option of alcoholic beverages at the meetings. They knew this wouldn't be allowed at the "Y", so they began looking for a different meeting place. It wasn't long before they found "The Greenleaf Inn", a hotel with a meeting room. It was voted on and the move was on.

At this point the name was changed to just Bluegrass Dive Club. The club continued at that location until the year of 2000, at which time the hotel was sold and torn down. The club moved to its current location "The Racquet Club". The current location offers the members the ability to buy alcoholic drinks and serves food if so desired. If all goes well, the club should be there for a long time.
