

Safety Corner

On the other hand, not all briefings are good. I remember long ago, on a trip on the Sun Dancer live-aboard in the Turks and Caicos, every single briefing was the same. After a few days, we jokingly offered to do the dive briefing, just repeating the same line: "There is a small wall behind the boat, as you go down the wall, turn into the current and swim until you are at 1500 psi, then turn around and swim back to the boat on top of the wall. You may see some angelfish, turtles, and sometimes a shark over the edge of the wall."

The divemaster was shocked... "Have you been to this site before?" he asked. We all laughed, but you should not accept a cookie-cutter briefing. Ask questions, make sure you are aware of the topography of the underwater landscape, as well as the water temperature, visibility, current, and wind conditions.

When you go to a dive site, you are normally not the expert on the location. Let the real experts give you the low-down. Pay attention and make sure you are comfortable with all the information. You will see all the sights you paid to see, and have a safe dive. And, as always...

Getting the Most from Pre-Dive Briefings By Jim Bartlett

- **1. Read up.** When possible, read anything you can about each new site you'll be visiting before you arrive. That might help you have questions already formulated.
- **2. Know your destination.** From info in the diversater's briefing, record key stats and draw a rough copy of the site on your dive slate so you can refer to it below.
- **3. What to expect.** Making a note will help you remember to look out for unfamiliar species your DM discusses. Ask if the boat carries laminated fish ID pages or a critter book.
- **4. What to avoid.** Pay attention to discussions of local restrictions and dangers such as live ordnance on a WWII wreck, poisonous fish and overhead environments.



5. Reminders. Given that each dive site has its own unique attributes — and your life is potentially at stake — being reminded of even

familiar signs and procedures is time well spent.

6. Questions. If you have questions about what you've heard, the briefing is the best time to get them answered — before you begin your descent! ►
