Safety Corner

Remember, safe diving is fun!

Note: Looking ahead to the BGDC dive trip calendar, one could get the impression that we should take over the old recruiting phrase from the Navy – "Join the Bluegrass Dive Club and see the world". We've always been an adventurous lot, even when there were dunk days in the Kentucky lakes or Tobermory Canada. Now, there are trips to Dominica, Belize, and Zanzibar. Although medical standards have improved drastically in these places, (anyone remember the \$12 hospital/doctor/medication bill in Yap??), you still need to prepare for your trip.

Here is an article from cdc.gov providing an overview of things you may want to consider in traveling to some of our remote dive locations. Obviously, individual needs are important, too, from making sure there is power for your CPAP machine or sterile water for your contacts, so add those things to your personal packing list. Having these things available will give you some added confidence to enjoy your vacation and maybe save a trip to a questionable infirmary.

Being safe on a dive trip starts before you leave home. As always, remember, safe diving is fun!

Pack Smart

The following things will be useful to have during your trip.

Copies of your passport and travel documents. Place a copy of your passport and travel documents in each piece of luggage, in case you lose the original documents. Don't forget to leave a copy with a friend or relative at home. (NOTE: Make sure your passport is intact – repair any damaged pages, or get a replacement passport. Trust me, you WANT to do this.)

Items that might go in your travel health kit.

Check the <u>Transportation Security</u> <u>Administration</u> website for updates on permitted and prohibited items, including medicines that you are allowed to carry onto an airplane.

Some items may not be allowed in other countries. It is a good idea to check the <u>Customs and Import Restrictions</u> section of the U.S. Department of State Tips for Traveling Abroad.

What to Pack in Your Travel Health Kit

Use this list to help you think of things to pack in your travel health kit. Be sure to think about where you are going and whether you will have access to health items and supplies.

Medicines

Special note about prescription medicines

Pack your prescription medications in your carry-on luggage.

Pack copies of all prescriptions, including the generic names for medications.

Pack a note on letterhead stationery from the prescribing physician for controlled substances and injectable medications.

Leave a copy of your prescriptions at home with a friend or relative.

Check with the American Embassy or Consulate to make sure that your medicines will be allowed into the country you are visiting. Some countries do not let visitors bring certain medicines into the country. Prescription medicines you usually take

If you have a severe allergy and epinephrine has been prescribed by your doctor, bring your Epinephrine auto-injector (for example, an EpiPen). Special prescriptions for the trip

Medicines to prevent malaria, if needed

Antibiotic prescribed by your doctor for self-treatment of moderate to severe diarrhea

Over-the-counter medicines

Antidiarrheal medication (for example. bismuth subsalicylate, loperamide) Antihistamine Decongestant, alone or in combination with antihistamine Anti-motion sickness medication Medicine for pain or fever (such as acetaminophen, aspirin, or ibuprofen) Mild laxative Cough suppressant/expectorant Cough drops Antacid Antifungal antibacterial and ointments or creams

Other items that may be useful in certain circumstances

1% hydrocortisone cream



Supplies to prevent illness or injury Insect repellent containing DEET (30%-50%) or picaridin (up to 15%) Sunscreen (preferably SPF 15 or greater) that has both UVA and UVB protection

Antibacterial hand wipes or alcoholbased hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol

Lubricating eye drops

First-aid supplies

First aid quick reference card Basic first-aid items (bandages, gauze, ace bandage, antiseptic, tweezers, scissors, cotton-tipped applicators) Moleskin for blisters Aloe gel for sunburns Digital thermometer Oral rehydration solution packets

Health insurance card (either your regular plan or supplemental travel health insurance plan) and copies of claim forms (NOTE: Make sure you have your dive insurance and trip insurance cards, too, especially with the phone numbers to call in case of concern over barotrauma.)

Mild sedative or other sleep aid Medicine to prevent altitude sickness Water purification tablets

Commercial suture/syringe kits to be used by local health-care provider. (These items will also require a letter on letterhead stationery from the prescribing physician.)

Pack to Prevent Zika

If you are traveling to an <u>area</u> with Zika, you can pack a few items in your travel health kit to protect yourself and your family. Your kit should include items that will reduce your risk of getting Zika. Reducing the risk of Zika is particularly important for pregnant women. Your kit should include:

Insect repellent (Look for these ingredients: DEET, picaridin, IR3535, OLE or PMD, or 2-undecanone.)

Long-sleeved shirts and long pants Clothing and gear treated with permethrin Infant carrier mosquito net (if needed) Bed net (if mosquitoes can get to where you're sleeping)

Condoms (if you might have sex)
